MCCLELLAN PARK DONATES \$2500 TO REBUILD RIVER CITY FOOD BANK

SACRAMENTO, CA – McClellan Business Park, one of California's largest recyclers of buildings, concrete, paint and asphalt has raised \$2,500 for the River City Food Bank with help from the local community on America Recycles Day. Sims Recycling Solutions, McClellan Business Park and News10 came together on Wednesday, December 8, 2011 at 8:00am to formally present the check to the River City Food Bank following the recent grand reopening of their facility.

"Like many communities across our nation, Sacramento has residents experiencing hardship due to the economic downturn, who are uncertain about where they will receive their next meal" said Larry Kelley, McClellan Park, President. "We are happy to provide this donation to help support the River City Food Bank's recovery."

The recycling event, held at McClellan Business Park, collected more than 50,000 pounds of e-waste and was covered by News10 with a live feed from Guy Farris with Sacramento & Co. The River City Food Bank recently reopened a temporary facility after a four-alarm fire destroyed its long headquarters on October 21, 2010.

McClellan Air Force Base was renamed McClellan Business Park (McClellan Park) in 2001.
